## **PROCLAMATION**

**WHEREAS**, the State of Mississippi regularly experiences the effects of severe weather, and throughout the State's history, numerous lives have been lost and tremendous economic damage has been caused by severe weather; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of Mississippi experienced 85 tornadoes in 2024, 22 of which occurred in the months of March, April, and May; and

WHEREAS, 13 tornadoes, severe storms, flooding, and straight-line winds impacted 6 counties across Mississippi on April 8-11, 2024, causing widespread damage and 2 deaths; and

WHEREAS, history has demonstrated that well-informed and well-prepared citizens sustain less personal injury and fewer property damages as a result of floods and severe storms; and

**WHEREAS**, Mississippians should be aware that they can take an active role in improving their ability to survive and recover from tornadoes by having a NOAA Weather Radio or multiple ways to receive warnings and knowing what to do when severe weather threatens; and

WHEREAS, the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency and the National Weather Service are urging Mississippians to be prepared for the upcoming spring season. The Mississippi Emergency Management Agency continues to prepare for tomorrow's disaster today through education focused on individuals, families and communities.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** I, Tate Reeves, Governor of the State of Mississippi, hereby proclaim February 9 through February 15, 2025, as:
